## Principal's Report

Dear students & families,  
I wanted to take the opportunity in this week's Principal's Report to update you on some exciting new projects being developed by the School-Wide Positive Behaviour Support Committee at Naranga School. This term staff have been handing out Commendation Cards. Students can receive a Commendation Card when they are 'caught' demonstrating one of our key expectations. A key element of good SWPBS practice, is providing recognition to students when they are doing the right thing. This builds a culture of positivity that promotes pro-social behaviour and reinforces the school expectations. On the SWPBS page in the newsletter, we have also started tracking how many Commendation Cards are earned by students each fortnight. I am happy to report that so far this term that number has steadily risen each week. We started out with 85 Commendations 6 weeks ago, then 187, and this fortnight students earned 252 Commendations! Please read the SWPBS page with your son or daughter and ask them how many Commendation Cards they have received recently. Another exciting project in development is extending the Naranga House system. The goal is to promote cross-age mentoring, complete House activities with an SWPBS focus and eventually award House points that recognise an annual House champion. By the end of this year we are aiming to have house logos designed and printed on house t-shirts. Students will be able to identify their house and be ready to engage in house activities in 2019. 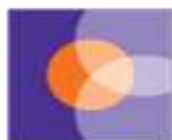
