Emergency Contact Details



Caroline: I liked the sand art and wished we had more time to make another one.

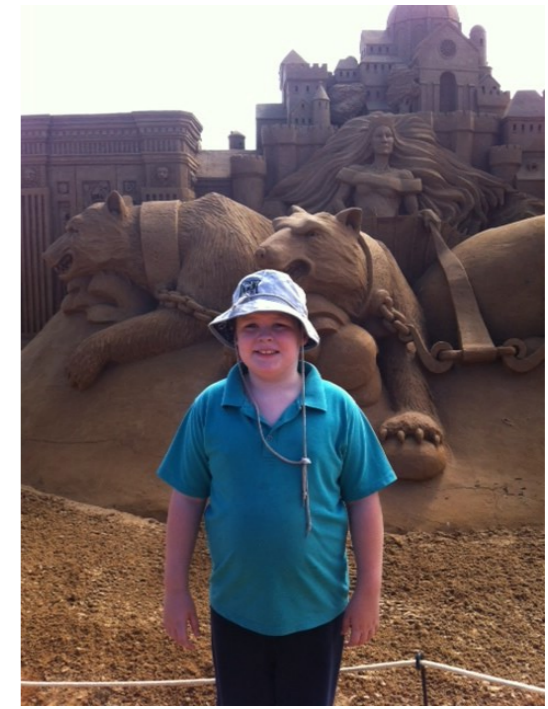
Len: I made a toy slider out of sand.
