Respectful Blue House meet Mrs Harrison at the BER

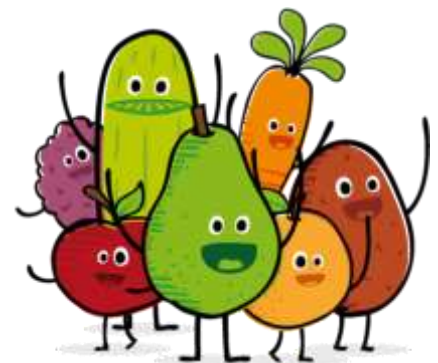
Responsible Green House meet Ms Step at the Wellbeing room
